Supervisor Szczepaniak opened the public hearing at 6:20 p.m.

The Town Clerk read the following legal notice for the public hearing:

Ms. Spoonogle, of 15 White Beach Road, stated her concern was not so much with the water extension but with the address of 10 White Beach Road. There is no mail delivery down White Beach Road and there are now 30 mail boxes on Route 50. There are also no school buses that go down the road. The map of the proposed area shows there is a private road going along White Beach Road to Route 50 by the motel. *Ms. Spoonogle* asked why can't the address of the subdivided lot be "Route 50". The entrance of White Beach Road is a hazard for people getting their mail, waiting for school buses and getting on and off of Route 50. The speed limit is 55 m.p.h. She is concerned with the added number of mailboxes on Route 50, and an increase of traffic on the road and connector road with this project. The solution is to move the mailboxes not add anymore.

Ms. Voehringer echoes what *Ms. Spoonogle* stated.

Ms. Bell, of 14 White Beach Road, wasn't sure where Lot #10 was on the map. A discussion between the applicant and Board members showed *Ms. Bell* where the property is located. The applicant also explained to *Ms. Bell* the process of how he plans on extending the water to his property. *Ms. Bell* asked why didn't the applicant extend the water down White Beach Road. *Kathryn Serra*, Town engineer, stated that this is a private service line to the home, paid for by the applicant, and not owned by the Town. The Town Board could allow the applicant to extend into the water district.

Supervisor Szczepaniak closed the public hearing at 6:40 p.m.
